



Daisy Brand to Build New Facility in Boone

The Iowa Economic Development Authority announced the approval of an incentives package in April that will bring a new state-of-the-art production facility to Boone, Iowa. Daisy Brand plans to invest \$626.5 million in a 750,000 square foot facility, creating 106 new jobs to start, a number anticipated to grow up to 255 as demand increases.



HOUSING

Kading Properties Groundbreaking in Boone

As we invest more resources into supporting housing across the region, it's always fun to celebrate a groundbreaking event. In October, we were in Boone as Kading Properties officially broke ground on Kate's Landing, a 128-unit development that is projected to be a \$15 million investment in Boone. The first tenants are expected to take occupancy by July 1, 2025.

WORKFORCE HOUSING TAX CREDITS

In August, several housing projects were awarded Workforce Housing Tax Credits from the Iowa Economic Development Authority.

- Page Flats, Prairie Place Housing Development (Hunziker Development Group), Kate's Landing (Kading Properties, LLC) will bring a combined 179 new housing units to the Boone community.
- Schlenker Construction in Ogden has also been awarded funds for their housing project that will bring six units to the community.
- **Diamond F Properties** and their Trailside Nevada housing development will have four new units.



A new \$1.2 million childcare facility project is underway in Slater, lowa, with funding support provided by the City of Slater, Story County Board of Supervisors, Consumers Energy, and the private facility owner. The new facility will expand services across the region and increase number of childcare slots with a target opening date of May 2025.

OFFICIALLY OPEN IN 2024



After years of planning and 15 months of construction, Wyffels **Hybrids** officially opened their lowa site on July 10, 2024 in the Prairie View Industrial Center. In December. they shipped out their first seed corn load.

Construction of the \$32 million Fitch Family Indoor Aquatic Center is underway in Ames. Thanks to private fundraising, an investment by the City of Ames, and a Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT) grant from the Enhance Iowa Board, a groundbreaking event took place in April 2024.

When complete, the project will provide year-round recreational swimming opportunities in the community. It will support aquatic education classes and include a lap pool, recreational pool with play structure, have a current channel, and an indoor/outdoor water slide.

Hamilton County Signing Event

In May, we celebrated our new partnership with **Hamilton County** and the **City of Webster City**, at a signing ceremony at Briggs Woods Golf Course. This agreement extended our economic development efforts from Boone County and Story County to now include Hamilton County.



In addition to playing a vital role in attracting **Daisy Brand** to the region, the Boone County Economic Growth Corporation assisted in Community Catalyst Building Remediation grants for Downtown Boone and **housing development** across the region.



It has been a high priority for the City of Nevada and the Nevada Economic Development Council to attract a new hotel, bringing greater lodging opportunities to the community. This year, NEDC conducted a **hotel study** that reinforced this need. An additional highlight of the year was helping bring The Well, a new **brewery** to Downtown Nevada.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES:

- The Rising Leaders Academy is an 8-month program that empowers high school students to become effective leaders in their schools and communities. Ten students from Ames, Boone, Colo-Nesco, and Nevada school districts participated.
- **Ukrainian Refugee Small Business Seminar Series** included two seminars to help Ukrainian refugees start a small business in the U.S., featuring 4 business presentations.

• See Yourself in Ames hosted six summer events to encourage local college interns to remain in the Ames area, culminating in a graduation and professional headshots.

MASTER PLANNING

The City of Ames, Ames Main Street, and the Ames Regional Economic Alliance are collaborating to develop a Master Plan for the future of downtown. The Master Plan will serve as a compass by setting forth a vision and creating a set of prioritized recommendations that will guide future growth and development of Downtown Ames. The plan will provide a guide for improving the area over the next 15 plus years, understanding that the area will continue to adapt to market changes and needs.

Based on feedback from the public survey that garnered over 1,000 responses, members of the Master Plan Steering Committee, in collaboration with Bolton & Menk, developed the plan.

The Ames Main Street Master Plan is expected to be released publicly in early 2025.
















TRACTION Magazine


